### JACK'S MIAMI

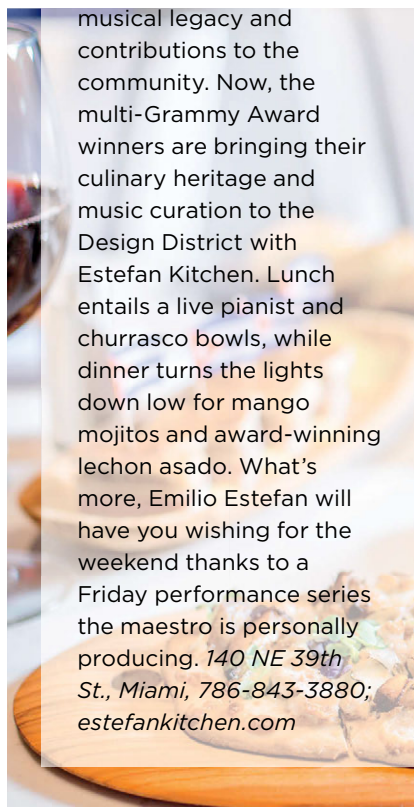
